ABSTRACT

This article analyzes the development of international legislation, as well as the legislation of individual states regarding the legal regulation of compensation for environmental damage. The authors identified and analyzed two levels of regulation. The first level is international, it includes acts adopted or approved by a group of states. The conclusion about the existence of general rules of legal regulation in the legislation of various states is formulated.
